Guardianship is an order granted by the Children's Court that allows relatives, kin or foster carers to have both legal and decision making responsibility for the care of a child or young person.

Guardianship is designed to ensure that children and young people have a permanent, safe and stable home until they reach the age of 18, without cutting legal ties to their family.

Guardianship orders are considered when there is evidence that the carer can provide a safe environment that supports a child for life. As a guardian, you will still receive a carer allowance to support the everyday expenses of raising a child.

We are looking for carers who have the ability to meet the long term needs of a child or young person independently, in all aspects of their life.

Together with the child or young person, their family, significant others, William Campbell Foundation and other services, we will work towards creating a permanent and supportive home for the child or young person.
